Score ranges show how much scores might vary if a student were to take the PSAT/NMSQT® repeatedly without learning additional skills. In other words, the scores within this range are considered equal, statistically.

Students can see at a glance how they performed across skill categories. At **My College QuickStart**, students can see which questions are associated with each skill.

On the report, percentiles show students how they performed compared to test-takers across the country. At **My College QuickStart**, students can also see how they compared to test-takers in your state.

Scores are only a small piece of the overall report. This report is the student's key to a whole system of tools online. At **My College QuickStart™**, students can find their projected SAT® scores and a personalized study plan.

These are the same skills measured on the SAT. At **My College QuickStart**, students have access to a personalized SAT study plan, including hundreds of practice questions and suggestions for improving the skills that need work.



For each question, the answer table displays the correct answer, the student's answer and the question difficulty level. At **My College QuickStart**, students can review questions they missed, sorting further by skill, difficulty or question type.

If students don't understand why they missed a certain question, they can find questions and detailed answer explanations at **My College QuickStart**.

Score reports include the college major in which students expressed interest when they took the PSAT/NMSQT. Use this information as a starting point for conversations about college and career planning.

Encourage students to take a personality test at **My College QuickStart** to find other majors and careers that fit their interests.
